Footnotes

DARTH TATER moved to a slim lead approaching the seven sixteenths pole, dueled clear on the final turn, lasted well and was in hand nearing the wire. MILLWOOD settled off the pace inside, bid nearing the quarter pole, was blocked from mid turn, angled to the rail at the head of the lane and finished well for place. SPEEDY TUXEDO moved to a slim brief lead between horses leaving the three eighths pole, gave chase past that point but leveled off through the lane. CHIGGER ROO showed the way inside the opening turn, gave chase from the three eighths pole, rounded the final turn evenly then leveled off down the lane. GANGA, well back outside, bid from the seven sixteenths pole and finished evenly. ALLEN'S MONSTER, five wide into the opening turn, gave chase past the half mile pole and had little left in the lane. DOC'S DANCER came away awkwardly, was checked leaving the first turn and not a factor.
