Footnotes

MAD LOUIE rated just off the early pace inside, bid between horses to take over near the five sixteenths pole, contested a slim advantage rounding the final turn and dug in through the stretch to hold on well. BULLET CATCHER settled close to the early pace about the four path, bid four wide leaving the three eighths pole and loomed a close factor to the end while getting up for place late. ALL MYSELF took a slim lead inside entering the first turn, was pressured from the three eighths pole, gave up control just past the pole but continued a close factor to deep stretch before reluctantly yielding. LEADHILLS rated off the pace in the four path, bid nearing the five sixteenths pole, rounded the final turn four wide and finished evenly. MCNAIR AND ADGER dropped back early while angling toward the outside, settled off the pace widest, bid from the three eighths pole and finished evenly. STREET NOISE settled well back off the rail. BACKINTHECOTTON stalked the early pace two deep, steadied from between horses at the five sixteenths pole and faded from there. PATRIOTTOWN was no factor in the three and four paths.
