REBEL CHALLENGER pressed the early pace from the outside, remained forward entering the drive, dueled with ZITHER SONG through the drive and outfinished that one for the place. ZITHER SONG chased the early pace from the outside, dueled with REBEL CHALLENGER through the drive but was outfinished for the place. SANDRO PAZZO chased the early pace from the inside but could only improve position. EDDIE LOVES MONEY went evenly. HOTEL SIERRA had little interest. ALL WORK had a steady fade. TOMORROWS DOUBLE was outrun.
