Footnotes

TWENTY HAWKS settled off the pace along the inside, advanced inside down the backstretch, tipped two wide nearing the quarter pole, steadily gained, took command inside the sixteenth pole and drew clear late. MINE TRAIN stalked the pace three wide between rivals, took the lead near the three-eighths pole, set the pace along the rail around the far turn, was collared near the sixteenth pole and held clear for the place. EARLY STAR stalked the pace three and four wide, could not gain when roused near the quarter pole and held clear for the show under minimal stretch encouragement. EVENING CONCERTO was caught very wide around the first turn, raced three wide thereafter and failed to menace. GOOD GENERAL prompted the pace five wide around the first turn, bid two wide around the clubhouse turn, took the lead nearing the nine-sixteenths pole, was collared nearing the three-eighths pole, chased three wide into the far turn and tired around that bend. SWALLOW THE FIELD was up close while racing four and five wide through the opening half-mile then faded. ALL MYSELF set the pace off the rail, was used after a half-mile and was eased in the lane.
