WHY SEVENTEEN quickly set the pace and was well handled on the lead, dug in gamely when hooked in the stretch and prevailed. PRATT STREET had good position three wide, rallied in the upper stretch and drew close, could not get past the winner after a long battle but was clearly second best. DO THE CONGA was fractious in gate, had good position throughout, lacked a late response and went evenly. CRAFTY NOBLE unhurried early, failed to menace. NORTHERN LUST pressed the pace, faltered in the stretch. SILKYS LAST DEAL contended for three quarters, gave way in the stretch. LANDOPEDUSA saved ground and was outrun. COLE'S MAGIC STAR was no factor.
