JEFF T. went to the front, drove clear, led throughout and won under steady urging. PINECREST BOY pressed the early pace, forwardly placed throughout, proved no match for the winner, but was best of others. JULIE'S RED BANDIT pressed the early pace, eased back, made a late bid and got up for third. PENBOBEN lacked early speed and made a steady inside gain. ULAH TYSON raced in the middle of the field, came around the final turn four wide and finished evenly. DE QUINCY void of early speed, improved position, finished wide and was no factor. SUPER BOWL AFFAIR lacked early speed and was never a factor. DIAMONDS R BETTER raced within striking distance, came around the first turn four wide and faded. ORIZA raced in the middle of the field, came around the first turn five wide and retreated. MISSISSIPPI MAN always raced near the back and showed little.
