MAY SING THE BLUES was allowed to settled then rallied four wide on the far turn, was in a strong drive on the outside and powered to the front in late stretch. TIME'S CONCERN was stalking the pace from the inside early on then moved out to be three wide heading into the far turn, rallied to take command then drew off in the middle of the turn, was in a hard drive but could not last in late stretch. SUNDAY PREMIERE was unhurried early then moved out and rallied five wide in upper stretch, was closing ground willingly in late stretch to finished well. GASTON was unhurried early then rallied on the far turn, moved out to be six wide for the stretch drive and closed willingly but was outfinished for the show. CREDIT ONLY was allowed to settled then rallied three wide on the far turn making a bid but came up empty in the drive. NOBLE SMITH dueled for the lead while two wide, was in a long drive throughout then weakened in the stretch. LASTRAW was allowed to settled while inside, started a run into the far turn then was blocked behind rivals and waited for clear running room until mid stretch then angled out to be four wide but was no menace in the end. NOT TOO PROUD was unhurried early then inside on the far turn, was blocked in upper stretch and lacked racing room in the stretch. BEAT THE CHEAT dueled for the lead while inside, was in a long drive then gave way in the stretch. MINER BIRD stalked the pace while three wide, was used up and faltered.
