PILFER, well placed close up outside rivals, was sent up outside the pacesetter on the far turn and gained the lead at the top of the stretch and drew clear then drifted in the stretch and turned back the challenge of HOPELESSLY DEVOTED. HOPELESSLY DEVOTED, well placed close to the pace near the inside, responded well in the stretch to close the gap. FROM AWAY, never far back, rallied mildly from the outside to gain the show. SPEEDY FALCON broke alertly, saved ground setting pace to stretch then weakened under pressure. MANY MANY BOWS was slowest away then lacked a rally. SLEWVILLE prompted the pace for six furlongs then weakened in the drive. VIA SACRA was forwardly placed to the far turn then tired.
