PERSONAL GOOD moved up outside rivals into the backstretch to prompt the pace then tired. PERSONAL EDGE saved ground disputing the pace and tired. SAYERS disputed the pace racing two wide then tired. GALLANT GULCH pulled up straightening into the backstretch.
