JOKER FACE sent to the early lead, set the pace a bit off the rail, inched away again when PARABLE loomed up leaving the first turn, kicked clear on the second turn, maintained a safe margin while drifting in a bit under left handed urging in the stretch and was under steady handling late, then returned bleeding in the mouth. PARABLE stalked the winner then bid alongside that one leaving the first turn, tracked that rival off the fence on the backstretch and second turn, angled in some approaching the stretch, could not match strides through the drive but narrowed the gap some in the late stages.
