Footnotes

CREATIVE CAUSE a bit slow into stride, saved ground chasing the pace, moved up inside leaving the backstretch, came out midway on the turn, angled three deep into the stretch, rallied to the lead outside the pacesetter past midstretch and proved best under a left handed crack of the whip and steady hand urging. I'LL HAVE ANOTHER had good early speed and dueled inside, came out a bit early on the turn then angled in, inched away in the stretch, could not match the winner in the final sixteenth but was clearly second best. MIGHTY MONSOON broke out and was a bit slow to begin then dropped back just off the rail, moved up inside leaving the turn, came out in upper stretch and gained the show. BRIGAND pulled his way up four wide early, dueled three deep then outside a rival to the stretch and weakened. NIGHT TIDE also pulled early when off the rail, stalked outside a rival then a bit off the fence, angled in for the turn and also weakened. GALEX tugged between horses pressing the early pace then stalked outside a rival or off the rail, dropped back some on the turn, came out in the stretch, was a bit crowded nearing midstretch and also weakened.
