Footnotes

THE BORG QUEEN pulled her way along and was bumped between horses into the first turn, stalked outside, bid three deep on the backstretch, took a short lead on the second turn, angled in leaving that bend, fought back when headed in the stretch and came back on while bumping with the runner-up in deep stretch. CRAFTY MADNESS also bumped into the first turn, chased outside, moved up four wide on the second turn, challenged alongside the winner leaving that bend, took the advantage nearing midstretch, came in and bumped with the winner in deep stretch and was outgamed. MYOFFICEWIFE also bumped into the first turn, stalked just off the rail, angled in for the second turn, came out in upper stretch and picked up the show. HOPEFUL SEASON angled in and saved ground off the pace, came out on the second turn and four wide into the stretch and lacked a further response. LAUGHING SUNRISE sent between horses to the early lead, set the pace off the rail or between foes, dropped back three deep on the second turn and had nothing left for the stretch. SULZANO pulled her way along inside stalking the early pace, bid inside and took a short lead on the backstretch, was briefly between horses on the second turn while dropping back, continued just off the inside and gave way. The stewards conducted an inquiry into the stretch run between the top pair but made no change when they ruled both runners contributed to the contact between them.
