Footnotes

NO DREAM chased inside, came out on the second turn, was fanned four wide into the stretch, came out some and was floated out through the late stages by the riderless horse but got up under urging at the wire. SKELLYTOWN chased outside, moved up three deep leaving the turn, was fanned four wide into the stretch, took the lead, was bothered and floated out by the riderless horse through the final furlong, steadied behind that one late and was edged on the line. JOE CARL angled in and saved ground off the pace, came out on the second turn and three deep into the stretch, angled in and went around a rival in the stretch and finished willingly toward the inside. FIERY TRIPPI stalked the pace off the rail, bid outside the winner then split horses leaving the second turn, was fanned out by the riderless horse into the stretch and steadied, then lacked the needed response. LUCIUS ANTONIUS stalked a bit off the rail then inside, continued toward the rail in the stretch and lacked a late response. AUTOCUE (GB) settled outside then alongside a rival, came out on the second turn, was fanned six wide into the stretch and lacked the needed rally. GOLD TRIM unhurried off the rail early, went three deep on the backstretch,

came out leaving the second turn, was floated five wide into the stretch and could not summon the necessary response. DAY WITH DESI sped to the early lead, set the pace inside then a bit off the rail, steadied in tight off the heels of the riderless horse into the second turn, dropped back between foes leaving that turn and had little left for the stretch. VICTORIAN PRINCE (IRE) stumbled badly at the start and lost the rider. The stewards conducted an inquiry into the start before ruling VICTORIAN PRINCE was the cause of his own trouble.
