Footnotes

FRENZO dueled for the lead three deep down the backstretch, came into the stretch between horses, kept to his task in the final furlong and wore down the pacesetter in the final yards. BLUE ROCK dueled for the lead on the inside down the backstretch, inched clear around the turn, maintained a clear advantage in midstretch and was worn down in the final yards on the inside. CRESTATORRE chased the pace outside a rival into the turn, came into the lane three wide, rallied on the outside through the final furlong and had to settle for the show. THUNDER CANYON chased inside a rival into the turn, bumped with that foe approaching the quarter pole, angled out for the stretch drive and just missed the show. TIZ ROYAL chased inside a rival into the turn, saved ground around the turn, remained on the wood in the lane and failed to mount the necessary rally. COMPETENT chased on the outside down the backstretch, was bumped and steadied approaching the quarter pole and could not make up the needed ground in the lane. PLEASANT SOUL dueled for the lead between horses down the backstretch, began to weaken between foes on the turn and fell back in the stretch drive.
