Footnotes

AXTEC stalked the pace three deep early and between rivals on the backstretch, continued off the inside, rallied to the front past midstretch and pulled clear under urging. KAAACHING sped to the early lead and angled in, set the pace inside, shortened stride in the final furlong and just saved second, then did not return to be unsaddled when tying up but was walked off. WISHINGMAKESITSO, bobbled slightly at the start, settled off the inside, made a three deep move leaving the backstretch and on the second turn and just missed the place. ORDER A DANCE, was taken out when a bit tight off heels into the first turn, angled in and saved ground, moved up inside on the second turn but lacked the needed late response. PRINCESS CANDI bumped into the first turn, saved ground stalking the pace, drifted wide on the second turn and gave way. TEE FOR THREE, five wide early and four wide on the first turn, continued to stalk the leader outside but had little left upon reaching the second turn. SOVIET SALLY, bumped between horses into the first turn and steadied, dropped back, angled in and also gave way, then was unsaddled a pole from the wire and was vanned off.
