FOR THREE-YEAR-OLDS AND UPWARD. By subscription of \$200 each, which shall accompany the nomination, \$3,000 additional to start, with \$200,000 Guaranteed, of which \$120,000 to first, \$40,000 to second, \$24,000 to third, \$12,000 to fourth and \$4,000 to fifth. The Del Mar Handicap has been selected as one of the Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" Challenge Races. The winner of the Del Mar Handicap will be entitled to automatic entry into the 2010 running of the Breeders' Cup Turf, subject to the payment of all pre-entry, entry and supplementary (if applicable) fees. To be eligible for the 2010 Breeders' Cup Championships to be held at Churchill Downs on November 5-6, 2010, all horses must be pre-entered by noon (local time at the designated pre-entry locations) by October 25, 2010. All applicable fees shall accompany the pre-entry. Weights Sunday, August 22. High weights preferred. A trophy will be presented to the owner of the winner. Nominations closed Thursday, August 19, 2010 with 19. (Rail at 14 feet).

Footnotes

CHAMP PEGASUS settled three deep then outside a rival, angled in on the final turn, rallied along the rail in the stretch to gain the lead under urging past midstretch and proved best. BUENOS DIAS (IRE) settled inside then a bit off the rail, went outside a rival into the last turn, came three deep into the stretch, angled out in the drive and just got the place. WORTH REPEATING chased inside, came off the rail with a bid in the drive to gain the lead, was between horses in midstretch and held third. FALCON ROCK (IRE) broke a bit slowly, pulled his way along inside chasing the pace, came out leaving the final turn and into the stretch, bid three deep in the drive, had the rider lose the whip a sixteenth out and was outfinished. SOUL CANDY steadied between foes just after the start, settled inside or a bit off the rail, continued along the rail on the final turn and into the stretch, came out some late and lacked the needed rally. DYNAMIC RANGE unhurried between horses then outside a rival, went three deep on the last turn and into the stretch and could not offer the necessary late kick. RED EYE EXPRESS (IRE) sped to the early lead and angled in, set the pace inside or off the rail, opened a lengthy advantage, drifted out into and in the stretch, steadied while dropping back in midstretch and had little left in the final furlong. MEGASTAR chased inside, went outside a rival on the final turn and into the stretch and lacked a rally. SPORTING ART saved ground chasing the pace, dropped back leaving the backstretch and on the last turn, gave way readily and was eased but walked off.
