STAKES Del Mar Futurity Grade 2 - Thoroughbred

FOR TWO-YEAR-OLDS (FOALS OF 2003). By subscription of \$250 each if made on or before June 3, 2005, the fee to accompany the nomination. For horses not nominated, supplementary nominations of \$10,000 each will close at the time of entry, Sunday, September 4. All horses shall pay \$500 to pass the entry box and \$2,000 additional to start, with \$250,000 Guaranteed, of which \$150,000 to first, \$50,000 to second, \$30,000 to third, \$15,000 to fourth and \$5,000 to fifth. Weights: colts and geldings, 123 lbs.; fillies, 120 lbs. Non-winners of \$50,000 twice allowed 2 lbs.; of such a race, 4 lbs. of \$25,000 other than maiden or claiming, 6 lbs.; of a race other than claiming, 8 lbs. Nominations closed Friday, June 3 2005, with 173. Supplementary nominations closed Sunday, September 4, 2005, with 2. A trophy will be presented to the owner of the winner.

STEVIE WONDERBOY unhurried off the rail on the backstretch, came out on the turn and five wide into the stretch and closed gamely under energetic handling to gain the lead past midstretch, then pulled clear under a long hold late. THE PHARAOH pressed the pace inside, was shuffled back into the turn, angled out into the stretch and came back on for second. JEALOUS PROFIT slammed hard and shut off at the start, settled inside, split horses into the stretch and finished well. ONE UNION had good early speed and dueled between horses, fought back in the stretch and weakened some late. OLD THUNDER bumped at the start, steadied in tight early, settled off the rail, went outside on the turn and four wide into the stretch and lacked the needed rally. A. P. WARRIOR vied for command between horses on the backstretch and inside on the turn, fought back in the stretch but also weakened late. BASHERT fractious in the post parade, pressed the pace four wide then three deep on the turn, put a head in front in the stretch but weakened in the final furlong. PLUG ME IN forced the early pace between horses, stalked outside on the turn and weakened in the stretch. JOHN HENNESSY chased outside then off the rail on the turn and had little left for the stretch. DINNER MAGIC broke in onto foes and was bumped, chased between horses then a bit off the rail, dropped back leaving the turn and gave way. EL SENOR HALO bumped at the start, saved ground off the early pace, drifted out leaving the backstretch, was pulled up on the turn but walked off.
