### Footnotes

MOUNTAIN BALLAD settled inside early, moved up along the rail on the second turn, angled four wide into the stretch, took over, then was fully extended to hold CATNIRO safe. The latter, well placed inside, saved ground until the final quarter, came out six or seven wide for the drive and was going well at the end. VIVA PENTELICUS gained the lead inside early, moved clear, made the pace into the final furlong and weakened. CARSON CITY KID, within easy striking distance and saving ground into the last eighth, angled four wide at the sixteenth pole but couldn't muster a final response. ARMADA was unprepared for the start, ducked out, was steadied and outrun until the stretch, came well off the inside for the drive and offered a mild gain. DYNATRON pressed front-running VIVA PENTELICUS until the stretch while three or four wide and tired. WILD DREAM followed the pace five or six wide until the final quarter and weakened. OFFENSIVE failed to menace. EXPLODO RED forced the pace for almost a half and faded. BEHAVIOUR (GB), sluggish to begin, was always outrun.
