Footnotes

UNIQUE DANCER settled inside, angled from between foes three wide at the quarter-mile ground, wrested command and was ridden out to the wire. MIRACLES, within striking distance while five wide from early on, was just off the winner for the final furlong but couldn't menace as second best. PRECOCIOUS GAL, bumped soundly at the start, raced in contention throughout but was empty in the drive. VAL'S DIABLO bobbed at the start, then swerved out soon after and jolted BROACH forcing that one out on PRECOCIOUS GAL, moved up soon after to vie for the lead, held on well until the stretch and faded. DANA'S JEWEL was outrun early and passed tired rivals. BROACH, jolted at the start and forced out, battled for the lead the opening half and tired. GIGLET, bumped at the start, was outrun. BRIGHT DAY drifted out at the start bumping GIGLET, then gave way early.
