**Footnotes**

SOLD OUT close up while off the inside, challenged once in the stretch and edged clear under steady urging. BIG BOY CHARLIE forwardly placed from the start, raced four wide on the turn and lodged a mild bid for the place. LUCKY EXPRESS set the pace near the rail, held on well to the final furlong and weakened. ROCKY BEAR outsprinted early, saved ground on the turn, angled out with a sixteenth to go but lacked a late bid. HOMETOWN LEGEND within striking distance, raced in the five path on the turn and lacked a rally. HOME OF THE GOLD outrun in the three path, found his best stride too late. MAD AFTERSHOCK forced the pace three wide, held on well to the stretch and tired. BANDMAN seven wide into the turn when within reach, angled in midway through the turn and tired. BLUE CHERRIES SPIN was no threat while off the rail. AINTTHATAKICKINTHE six wide in the turn when close up, faded.
