In the event this race is not divided it will be limited to 12 starters. Preference to start will be given to those horses having accumulated the highest career earnings at he closing of entries on Thursday, August 2, 2001. However, two horses having common ties through ownership cannot start to the exclusion of a single interest.

Footnotes

VALORY gained the lead inside early, controlled a fast pace, repelled a bid from DRESSED IN GOLD a quarter-mile out, then was hard ridden to hold CASUAL FEAT safe. The latter, unhurried early while near the inside between foes, moved four or five wide approaching the stretch, loomed menacingly outside the winner through the drive and wasn't good enough. THE HESS EXPRESS worked her way inside early, saved ground into the stretch, angled outside the top two for the final sixteenth but couldn't muster the needed response. DIAMOND BRACELET, outrun for nearly six furlongs while five or six wide, made a mild bid to reach contention in the upper stretch but failed to continue. MORNING RIDE saved ground but flattened out when the test came. DRESSED IN GOLD moved up early to press the winner from the outside, challenged earnestly a quarter-mile out but tired soon after. TOWN QUEEN never menaced. NATURALRESEHORSE tracked the pace from the outside to the end of the backstretch and tired. JENNY LAKE gave way by the end of the backstretch.
