CIMPLY SAVIO, unhurried to the far turn, saved ground, moved between rivals while edging closer nearing the stretch, split foes when straightened for the drive and moved clear under hand urging. CRUISE ACROSS worked her way inside early, made a bold run from the rail to reach the front on the second turn but wasn't a match for the winner in the drive. LT. DOLLY, never far back, lacked a serious late response. RUTHLESS ONE, bumped at the start and taken in hand, saved ground, made a run five wide into the upper stretch, loomed prominently but failed to continue. GIRL'S SPORT gained the lead early, made the pace for nearly six furlongs, was headed by CRUISE ACROSS, battled with that one into the final furlong and faltered.. DIXIE NIMBLE failed to reach contention. PARTY ALL NIGHT ducked out at the start and jolted ROANOKE LADY, pressed the pace for six furlongs and weakened thereafter. ROANOKE LADY, slammed at the start and forced out, tired on the far turn.
