Footnotes

VADERATOR hesitated at the start, rushed to contend, opened a clear lead nearing the three-eighths pole, increased his advantage into the lane and held off the closing CHICKASAW PARK to prevail. CHICKASAW PARK was never far back, raced wide through the turn and finished with a steady rally. SMART AS JIM was away alertly to duel for the early advantage from off the rail and gave way gradually in the drive. ITSAFINEREDWINE lacked early speed, saved ground through the turn, angled out nearing the quarter and failed to gain late. EMERALDS BOY broke sharply then dropped off the pacesetters while racing from between foes, steadied nearing the quarter and did not reach contention thereafter. BEST VERSE showed no early speed, raced wide through the turn and was not a factor. FAST TRADE dueled for the lead from the outside and weakened after going a half.
