ITS TUESDAY broke in stride to take command at once, opened a clear lead before going a quarter, saved ground while setting the pace, turned back the bid of WILMAGLEN nearing the quarter pole and drew clear late. CORTINA was away alertly to race just off the leaders from between rivals, angled outside with three-sixteenths to run and finished willingly to gain the place. MIZ HEATHER showed no early speed, raced off the rail throughout and finished with good energy. WILMAGLEN pressed the pace from the outside, moved up to engage the winner with a quarter to run and could not stay with that rival in the drive. MISYODL lacked early foot, raced wide into the stretch and finished evenly. DOVEDALE was never far back while racing along the inside and lacked the needed closing response. DBLE DIAMOND NORMA raced wide into the lane and gradually weakened.
