Footnotes

HE'S A BARN RAT dueled for the lead racing between horses through a prolonged drive, and was fully extended to narrowly prevail. WALKIN MONEY dueled from the inside through a long drive, battled gamely but wasn't quite good enough. OUR SINGING BOY stalked the pace racing along the inside, got through to make a mild bid, lacked the needed late response to reach the top two, but finished fairly well to earn the show. MAKE A PLAN vied for the lead racing three wide, but weakened during the drive and gave way. WORKINHIEMER broke a step slow and was pinched back, split horses and made a steady advance, but was left with too much to do. COPS TRUE GRIT was hustled along racing five wide in mid pack and went evenly. BELLS A BOPPIN saved ground to little avail. DIAMOND SPELL chased the pace racing three wide, but came up empty entering the stretch and dropped out. LUCKY TONY veered in bumped WORKINHIEMER at the start getting away slowly, and showed little thereafter. BLEND DAT JAZZ was always outrun.
