Footnotes

LIGHT MY HEART was bumped at the start, lacked early speed, saved ground through the turn, angled out nearing the three-sixteenths pole, reached LIL RED ROCKSTAR with a furlong to run and edged clear of that rival in the drive. LIL RED ROCKSTAR was off a step slow, rushed up to duel for the lead from the inside with TY GOES GOLD, opened a clear margin into the stretch, responded when challenged by the winner and gave way grudgingly to that foe late. REGAL VALID was never far back, raced far wide through the turn, moved up to offer a bid nearing the eighth pole but could not match strides with the winner in the drive. BEAR CREEK ROAD showed no early speed, raced wide through the turn, angled out further into the lane and finished with a belated bid. RED COLT FORTYFIVE broke out, chased the leaders from the outside and gave way through the final furlong. TY GOES GOLD was bumped at the start, duelled for the lead from the outside, lugged out badly through the turn and dropped back quickly.
