Footnotes

COAST MERIDIAN set the pressured pace racing three deep, forged clear with three-sixteenths to run, and held safely during the drive. ANNIE'S BOU PEEP angled out five wide leaving the turn to launch her bid, and closed willingly to prove second best. SUPERLATIVE KRIS stalked the pace racing four wide, and steadily advanced to just be up for the show. DELICATEIRISHLACE pressed COAST MERIDIAN from the inside, but weakened in the upper stretch and faded. KEEP THE RING raced three wide throughout, and passed only the tiring ones. LADY KNOX was awkward into stride, and always outrun. DIVINE IMAGE chased the pace along the inside, but was caught in tight nearing the three-eighths pole and steadied sharply, then never recovered and dropped out.
