### Footnotes

MAKING FIRE sprinted clear at once, dueled for the lead from off the rail with GENIUNE GEM before going a quarter, responded when set down for the drive and edged away from that rival through the final yards. GENUINE GEM was away alertly to be sent up to vie for the early advantage from the outside, dueled through a prolonged drive but could not match strides with the winner late. THIS LAD IS GOLD lagged early, raced far wide through the turn and was up for the show. POINT DANGER was bumped at the start, lacked early speed, saved ground through the turn, drifted out slightly into the lane and failed to offer a bid. PROSPECTOROV was bumped at the start, raced off the leaders from between foes and did not threaten. RED BALL EXPRESS chased the leaders from the outside, moved inside nearing the three-sixteenths pole and gradually weakened.
