VICKYS FAST BOY stalked the leaders from the outside, moved up to take command into the lane and steadily drew off. PHIL THE BOOT broke in stride to talk command at once, opened a clear lead before going a quarter, saved ground while setting the pace and yielded to the winner in the drive. MISTER LICORICE lagged early, raced wide through the turn and found his best stride late. AMANTE MIO lacked early speed, saved ground throughout and finished evenly. STRAWBERRY TOPPER broke sharply to chase the leaders from the inside and gradually gave way.
