WAR ALERT was off a step slow, stalked the leaders from the inside, moved up to offer a bid nearing the three-sixteenths marker, quickly opened a commanding lead and increased his margin to the wire. HE'S A BARN RAT raced wide through the first turn, dropped off the pacesetters, moved inside into the stretch, could not gain on the winner but was clearly second best. PREMIER DIABLO was bumped at the start, raced wide through the second turn and was up for the show. CODE RED was bumped at the start, pressed the pace from the outside, was carried out approaching the stretch and lacked the needed closing response. OUR SINGING BOY broke sharply to set a pressured pace, lugged out through the turn and was taken up.
