SAND BANDIT was in mid pack, gained ground on the far turn, vied through the stretch and fought gamely for the win. WILDCAT PRINCE was in touch, a factor from the three path on the far turn and had the lead from the four path in deep stretch but was outgunned. EDGE was unhurried early, moved up on the backstretch and had a slim lead on the far turn but was outfinished. PENTHOUSE VIEW stalked the early leader but chased on the far turn and lacked a serious bid. BOULDER SPRINGS was well back, trailed the field on the far turn and passed tired foes through the stretch. DEPUTY LOR was off the pace and showed nothing while never a threat. SIR VIVA set the pace but dropped back into the far turn and had nothing left.
