COUNTRY MUSIC BOY was in touch, roused from the inside on the far turn and angled out at the top of the stretch to get up in time. GET TO IT was hustled early, had the lead on the far turn, vied through the stretch and fought gamely in defeat. TOASTING MIA stalked the leader from the outside, was a factor on the far turn and had a bid through the stretch but was outfinished. RINK RAT was well back, had a mild gain from the four path on the far turn and from the eight path through the stretch closed willingly. DEAFENING SILENCE was off the pace and showed little while never a threat. BLUEGRASS BEAR was unhurried early and hustled along from the three path on the far turn but from the seven path at the top of the stretch was outrun. MUSASHI WAY showed early speed but chased on the far turn and from the six path through the stretch was empty.
