WILD SONG rushed to the front soon after the start, set all the fractions and was never threatened. KAWANI RUN never far back, rallied four wide on final turn and closed willingly without threatening the top one. SMOKIN BOMB attended the pace to deep stretch and weakened. SPLASHMEE was slow into stride, bid inside and flattened before the stretch. ZARCO STAR raced wide through the first turn and did not reach contention. JANS SKY PETE showed little. COMING BY YA NOW (AUS) raced very wide through the first turn and had chances compromised. COIN PIPER clipped heels soon after the start, stumbled badly, then checked hard late in the first turn. An inquiry by the stewards in the problems of COIN PIPER resulted in the decision that he caused his own problems.
