Footnotes

ATLANTIC TITAN raced three wide on the first turn, set the pace through solid fractions, inched clear while off the rail on the far turn, responded well when put to a drive in upper stretch and held under strong urging. FLASHY SUNRISE went four wide on the first turn, settled towards the rear, was urged along while four then five wide on the far turn, came under the whip in upper stretch and finished willingly for the place. TUCKERS POINT went two to three wide on the first turn, settled off the pace, bided his time while off the rail on the far turn, was asked at the top of the stretch, moved out inside the furlong marker and finished willingly to just miss the place. MAJOR HOPE prompted the pace on the inside, chased on the far turn, moved off the rail near the five-sixteenths pole, held a good striking position into the final furlong but lacked the needed kick. BEER GARDEN went four to five wide on the first turn, settled on the outside, advanced four wide on the far turn, came under the whip in upper stretch and also lacked the needed kick. DONOHARM was rated on the inside, came under some urging on the far turn, saved ground into the stretch and lacked the needed response. PROPER EMPIRE went three wide on the first turn, settled in the back half of the field, went three wide on the far turn, moved out in upper stretch and gained late ground but failed to menace. CONGENIAL went three to four wide on the first turn, settled just off the pace, went three wide while between rivals on the far turn and weakened. EMPIRE TAKER went four to five wide on the first turn, settled just off the pace, was urged along while three wide on the far turn and came up empty. VASTEN lingered well back in the field, shifted four wide near the five-sixteenths pole, angled out sharply in upper stretch and failed to threaten. VPERYOD SERYOGA settled towards the rear, saved ground on the turns and was no factor. JULIUS CAESAR went five to six wide on the first turn, tracked the pace, chased four wide on the far turn and faded.
