### Footnotes

TONE IT DOWN prompted the pace on the outside, took the lead passing the three-eighths pole, inched clear in upper stretch and held sway under steady urging. VIGILANTE LAW raced three wide on the first turn, tracked the pace on the outside, made a bid while three wide on the far turn, lost touch with the winner in upper stretch and was outfinished while able to get the place. BROTHERS NICHOLAS was unhurried near the back while on the inside, came under urging on the far turn, saved ground into the stretch, rallied into the final furlong and finished fast to just miss the place. GOOD AND LUCKY was hustled from the start, saved ground on the first turn, settled off the pace, raced three wide while in hand on the far turn, was asked near the five-sixteenths pole, came four wide into the stretch and lacked the needed kick. CHEF ERIC was well placed while off the inside, came under urging near the five-sixteenths pole, moved out some in upper stretch and also lacked the needed kick. RECTOR raced three then four wide on the first turn, settled on the outside, was urged along while four wide on the far turn and lacked the needed response. ROCK HARD lagged at the rear of the field, was urged along while three wide on the far turn, moved a bit closer but failed to rally. MY RISENSTAR set the pace on the inside, lost the lead midway through the far turn and gave way.
