SOUTHERN DUDE moved out then was well placed in third, ranged up while four wide on the turn, was asked at the top of the stretch, gained the lead outside the furlong marker and edged clear under steady urging. HIT THE ROAD LEE tracked the pace, chased three wide on the turn, made a bid near the quarter-pole, chased the winner in the final furlong and was second best. TORO BRAVO set the pace, vied off the rail on the turn, was asked near the quarter-pole, lost the lead outside the furlong marker and weakened while able to hold the show. CHIEF JAY was ridden along on the outside, raced three wide on the turn and failed to rally. PATRYKUS bobbed at the start and was last away, settled on the inside, moved off the rail near the five-sixteenths pole, was asked outside the quarter-pole, angled out in upper stretch and failed to threaten. TOUGH BRUSH was urged along while off the pace, saved ground on the turn, came under the whip near the five-sixteenths pole and failed to respond. LITTLE DOLLAR settled near the back, went two then three wide on the turn, was asked near the five-sixteenths pole, moved to four wide outside the quarter-pole and was no factor.
