Footnotes

FLAT CHANCE settled on the inside, bided her time on the far turn, rallied along the rail on upper stretch, stormed to the front outside the furlong marker and drew away under strong urging. CELESTIAL SHOW raced four wide on the first turn, settled just off the pace on the outside, chased four wide on the far turn and secured the place while no match for the winner. ALREADY BLESSED set the clear pace while off the rail, lost the lead nearing the furlong marker and tired. CAT BELLS raced three wide on the first turn, tracked the pace, chased three wide on the far turn and weakened. LA POLI lagged at the rear of the field while off the rail, was urged along on the far turn, swung four wide at the top of the stretch and failed to threaten. IT'S A STAR settled towards the rear of the field, dropped back after five-eighths and faltered.
