BRICKYARD HELEN stalked the leader while under a snug hold, raced three wide on the turn, made a bid without being asked at the top of the stretch, drifted in while edging clear near the furlong marker, was put to a left-handed whip outside the sixteenth-pole and proved much the best. MEROM settled just off the pace on the outside, was urged along while four wide on the turn, came under a right-handed whip in upper stretch, switched to a left-handed whip passing the furlong marker, went back to the right-hand near the sixteenth-pole and was second best. REPUTA THE BEAUTAH settled off the pace, raced three wide on the turn, was asked near the five-sixteenths pole, came under a drive in upper stretch and finished willingly for the show. GRACIE'S JOY broke alertly then moved to a clear early lead, was taken in hand and set the pace under some restraint, vied off the rail early on the turn then dropped to the inside, lost the lead inside the quarter-pole and gave way then was caught for the minor awards. MRS. SENTEL settled at the back of the field, came under some urging while inside on the turn, moved out near the furlong marker and failed to rally. LUKEY'S LA TEE DA was rated just off the pace, raced off the rail on the turn, was asked in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole and came up empty.
