BELIEVE YOU CAN was asked from the start, prompted the pace on the inside, took the lead midway down the backstretch, inched clear on the far turn, extended the lead when set down in upper stretch, remained well clear into the final sixteenth and just held while drifting out under strong urging. SUMMER APPLAUSE raced three wide on the first turn, tracked the pace, was ridden along while three wide on the far turn, came under the whip outside the quarter-pole, gained ground in the final furlong and just missed. DISPOSABLEPLEASURE raced four wide early on the first turn then dropped to the inside, settled off the pace, was roused on the far turn and secured the show while no match for the top two. SMALL KITCHEN raced five then four wide on the first turn, settled on the outside, went four then three wide early on the far turn, chased the leader, dropped to one off the rail by the five-sixteenths pole and tired. COLONIAL EMPRESS set the pace while off the inside, lost the lead midway down the backstretch, came up empty on the far turn and faded.
