KING OF SPEED pressured the leader from the outside, took over from that foe in the second turn, gained a clear advantage when straightened for home, and held sway. CLAUDIA'S FORUM within striking distance, moved closer and lodged a mild bid three wide outside the winner turning for home, fell back off that foe nearing the furlong grounds and was all out to hold the place. CAJUN PRIZE back off the pace for six furlongs, ranged up five wide turning for home, lost ground as a result, set down for the drive, finished up willingly in the late going to be rapidly getting to the runner up. DRIVINGMAXANDMITZI moved a bit closer in the two path late in the final turn, lacked a further bid. CAJUN CONQUEST allowed to settle, loomed a threat four wide turning for home, hung in the drive. DEMPSEY set a soft pace just off the inside, gave way in the drive.
