REPUTA THE BEAUTAH broke out but came out in front, settled on the outside, raced four wide on the turn, was asked at the top of the stretch, rallied on the outside, was carried out a bit outside the furlong marker, closed well alongside WIMBLEDON STAR, battled gamely with that rival late and narrowly prevailed under strong urging. WIMBLEDON STAR tracked the pace on the outside, raced three wide on the turn, was asked at the top of the stretch, rallied on the inside of REPUTA THE BEAUTAH, drifted out a bit outside the furlong marker, closed well on the inside of the aforementioned rival, battled gamely late and just missed. SHE CAN FLY bumped lightly with the hindquarters of DONTBETELLINME just after the start then dropped back, settled at the rear, went two to three wide on the turn, was asked a bit outside the five-sixteenths pole, shifted five wide into the stretch, was put to a drive on the outside and finished willingly to grab the show at the wire. GOLDEN ALLURE was well rated on an easy lead, controlled the action while off the rail on the turn, was asked at the top of the stretch, came under the whip near the three-sixteenths pole, lost the lead outside the sixteenth-pole and was outfinished then caught for the show at the wire. DONTBETELLINME was bumped lightly in the hindquarters at the start, settled on the inside, saved ground on the turn, was asked passing the quarter-pole and lacked the needed response.
