SOUTHERN INVASION was reserved under tight restraint while off the rail on the first turn, dragged his way to the lead with five furlongs to run, raced on the front end through sluggish fractions, remained in hand while off the rail on the far turn, was asked in upper stretch, battled gamely with KISS MY KRISS and FIRST TO BINGO in the final furlong and narrowly prevailed under strong urging. KISS MY KRISS was reserved while three wide on the first turn, moved closer with a half-mile to run, advanced leaving the backstretch, engaged the leader without being asked while three wide on the far turn, was roused in upper stretch, battled between rivals in the final furlong and just missed. FIRST TO BINGO raced four then three wide on the first turn, stalked the pace on the outside while under a snug hold, went four wide on the far turn, was asked in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, chased the leaders into the stretch, made a bid near the eighth-pole, battled outside in the final furlong and missed. IDE MISS DIXIE was bumped on both sides at the start, raced five then four wide while a bit rank on the first turn, was reserved under a tight hold, came under urging while five then four wide on the far turn and lacked the needed kick. CAJUN DUST broke outward and awkwardly then bumped with a rival, raced four wide early on the first turn then dropped to one off the rail, was reserved near the back, came under urging while three wide on the far turn, was put a strong left-handed whip in upper stretch and also lacked the needed kick. EVACUATION bumped with a rival at the start, was a bit rank while six then five wide on the far turn, settled at the rear on the backstretch, was urged along while two then three wide on the far turn, came four wide into the stretch and failed to threaten. REW'S BLUES moved to the early lead, dropped in late on the first turn, lost the lead near the five-eighths pole, tracked near the inside, remained patient while near the inside on the far turn, was asked at the top of the stretch and lacked the needed response. SEA THE SOLDIER was a bit rank while rated under tight hold, threw his head early on the backstretch, dropped back near the half-mile pole, was urged along on the far turn, came three wide into the stretch and failed to respond. (Rail at 20 Feet)
