TUSHER MTN MAN never far back to the turn, circled four then five wide to the stretch, dug in gamely late and was best. MR. SIERRA was well placed off the leader to the turn, rallied three wide to duel for the lead to the stretch, responded to strong pressure but could not stall the winner late. RESTLESS YOUTH hopped at the start then stalked the pace to the turn, was fanned four wide to the stretch, dueled to mid stretch then was outfinished late. BUCK'S BRO chased the leaders to the turn, rallied three wide to the stretch, dueled to mid stretch then went evenly in the final sixteenth. IDLE CHATTER broke a bit slow and was trailing early, had to steady sharply when CHINESE PRAISE bore in sharply and cut him off, recovered, raced three wide to the stretch and finished with interest. CHINESE PRAISE was outsprinted in the early stages then bore in sharply nearing the nine sixteenths, steadied and was straightened but never threatened. HAYJAX sped clear early, set the pace to mid turn then tired and stopped in the stretch.
