Footnotes

CHERISHISTHEWORD contested the pace from outside MY MAN BOOMER to kick clear into the far turn, appeared to pull himself up around the three-sixteenths marker and lost the advantage then battled back in the stretch to wear down IRISH EDITION and prevail late. IRISH EDITION settled back off the pace racing three or four wide, launched his rally to bid about the time the winner eased up in the far turn, quickly moved clear then resisted through the lane but could not hold that one safe late. JAKE N LEVIS BLUFF rallied four wide to bid through the far turn but lacked a final closing response. GOATFEATHERS followed the pace racing out from the rail, checked from along the inside as a rival dropped over early in the far turn, moved out then had to weave his way through traffic into the stretch and made a mild late gain. ONE LAST YANKEE moved up three and four wide in the far turn then lacked a late response. GO GETTA tired racing four wide. SAM DIEGO showed brief speed from outside rivals for a quarter mile then gave way readily in the far turn. MY MAN BOOMER vied on the lead from along the inside early and gave way.
