NORTHERN INDIAN was allowed to settle early, moved up four wide into the upper stretch and finished gamely to get up under all out pressure. WHAZUPLITTLEMAN stalked the pace, raced in tight quarters at the eighth pole, moved up three wide and finished second best. MFAZI stalked the pace, raced along the inside and finished willingly to the wire. DOC TANNER set all the pace from the outside and tired. DON'S BABY was allowed to settle early along the inside, lacked racing room at the quarter pole, swung into the upper stretch and gained ground in the final stages. LITTLE THIEF raced four wide and never menaced. RANDYS MIRACLE was hustled along to press the pace and faded.
