Footnotes

CHERISHISTHEWORD was on the pace from between rivals in the tightly bunched field, dueled BACH'S HOMEBREW through the far turn into the lane and gamely held that one at bay. BACH'S HOMEBREW forced the pace from inside the winner throughout, briefly put a head in front turning for home and continued gamely to narrowly miss. FRANK DRACMAN was in a bit tight going to the first turn, settled in good position to track the leaders from three and four wide, responded when set down in the lane and narrowly missed from the outside. BINGOSABLUMIN was just off the leaders racing four to five wide, bid through the far turn then weakened a bit through the lane. GOATFEATHERS broke into the side of the gate and came away awkwardly, remained in good position while three or four wide throughout and could not produce the needed late effort. BRAND FORTY FOUR saved ground and failed to produce a closing bid. FIVE OCLOCK SHADOW forced the pace from outside rivals early and tired.
