Footnotes

SLICK MICK pressed from inside, waited for room on the turn, got through two wide at the top of the stretch, was quickly clear then maintained control under late urging. BOOGIE MAN JOE forwardly placed between horses, lost ground three to five wide through the bend, took over second midstretch but could only pull away for that position late. INDIAN PROPHET rated from inside, commenced his bid on the turn, swung out to path three for room into the lane, threatened with a furlong left but could only draw off for third in the waning yards. BELIEVE IN FROST displayed early speed just outside JESUIT WARRIOR, drifted out to path four entering the stretch and steadily yielded. KITTEN'S RULE raced in contention toward the outside on the backstretch, followed BOOGIE MAN JOE through the bend and only passed a couple tired ones late. JESUIT WARRIOR dueled for the lead just off or along the rail for a little more than a half mile but gave way in the stretch. LUCKY CHANGE hustled along from outside, helped prompt the pace on the backstretch but gave way widest leaving the turn.
