Footnotes

PAY O DAY gradually progressed from outside to reach contention five wide on the second bend, angled in some as he went for the lead leaving that turn, moved ahead upper stretch, was all out in the late going and held off SUNDAY SAINT. The latter was hustled up to the lead from inside, rated on the backstretch, floated out some leaving the second turn, was challenged from both sides in the lane, lost the advantage but dug in deep stretch and was coming back. VOYANT rated from outside for more than a half mile, gained a striking position four wide on the second turn, moved in beside SUNDAY SAINT entering the stretch, slowly closed the gap and moved clear for third late. WAAQAAD bumped with TWO SPOTS at the start, gradually advanced from inside to loom a threat upper stretch, was steadied when caught in tight quarters inside the final furlong, leveled off the last sixteenth and followed SUNDAY SAINT to the wire. ASFAAR reluctant to load, was settled between horses once the race began, picked up his pace approaching the second turn to be a contender two wide with a quarter mile left, lost ground fanning to path five into the stretch and was closing the gap inside the last sixteenth. FORCED ACTION without early foot, commenced his bid from inside into the second turn and slowly made up ground without threatening. PATRICKS BLUFFING displayed early speed outside SUNDAY SAINT, could not stay with that one leaving the second turn, was shuffled back entering the lane and gradually yielded. RED DIAMOND was soon well back, lodged a mild middle move just off the inside on the second turn, floated out four wide into the stretch, lugged in going to the furlong marker and could not sustain his bid. ARTEMUS JOY was a brief factor between rivals, failed to keep up on the backstretch, lost position three wide between horses on the second turn, swung out widest leaving that bend and weaved as he gave way upper stretch. TWO SPOTS bumped with WAAQAAD at the start, steadily faded, saved ground taking the second bend and proved unresponsive for the drive.
