Footnotes

TIO CHENCHO rated from outside, picked up his pace just off the inside on the second turn, swung three wide for a clear path into the stretch, split rivals inside the final sixteenth and began to draw off nearing the wire. COCKY BULL set a pressured pace just off the inside, moved clear upper stretch but did not have enough to hold off TIO CHENCHO the last seventy yards. SEYRULE kept close between rivals, went for the lead three wide on the second turn but could not sustain his bid in the lane and slowly yielded. FOX RAP displayed early speed from inside but gradually wore down the last quarter mile. CHEROKEE PAINT rated from inside, lost ground fanning five wide entering the stretch and found best stride too late. DR SWIFT soon trailed, saved ground, came off the rail some for the drive then made a strong but belated bid. TAXCO void of speed from outside, was widest taking the second bend and gradually lugged in through the lane as he closed the gap. KITTEN'S RULE gradually faded between rivals, fanned five wide into the stretch and had little to offer.
