Footnotes

LIL VALRIE SUE TOO soon angled in to be just off the inside as she shared the lead from outside, was two wide into and leaving the bend, shook free under hand urging upper stretch, was put to a drive inside the last furlong and held on. APT TO BE A STAR was hustled along while toward the outside from the early going, was in path four entering and leaving the turn, gradually angled out as EXPRESSIVE EYES came out the last eighth and swept past the latter in the waning yards as she closed on LIL VALRIE SUE TOO. EXPRESSIVE EYES pressed from inside, angled three wide midway on the backstretch, vied for the lead on the bend, could not stay with LIL VALRIE SUE TOO upper stretch, started to slowly drift out nearing the eighth pole and gradually yielded. CART'S CRUSIN was a contender from inside on the backstretch but began to fade along the rail leaving the turn. WILD HEIR void of speed from outside, angled in nearing the half mile marker, was just off the rail into the turn, fanned three wide for the stretch run and had no late bid. MISS BOCEPHUS a step slow at the break, rushed up between rivals to vie for the lead, soon had the rail, could not keep up early in the bend, was steadied briefly when her path narrowed near the five-sixteenths marker, floated out a bit leaving the turn and steadily gave way.
